Women in Christ United Food Pantry open Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday 12 p.m. – 2:30 p.m., also Thursdays 4 – 6 p.m. Available to Tippecanoe County residents once every 30 days. Other programs include Community Partners, a free and voluntary emergency assistance program, and the Youth Development Program, a free drop in program for youth ages 5 – 18 years old. Please note that 5 year olds must be enrolled and currently attending Kindergarten.

Bauer Early Care and Education

Bauer Family Resources operates Tippecanoe County's federally-funded, community –based Head Start program. The program promotes school readiness by enhancing the social, cognitive, language, and physical development of children ages 6 weeks to age 5 and pregnant women. This is accomplished through the provision of educational, health, nutritional, social and other services to the enrolled children and families.

Families of children age 6 weeks to 35 months may qualify for either the Home-based program or the full-day Center-Based program. 3 year old children are placed in our half-day preschool program and 4 year olds heading to kindergarten in the fall are placed in our full-day prekindergarten classroom.

The Pregnant Women's Program provides a foundation for pregnancy care, labor, & parenting. The program serves pregnant women and fathers or support people during the duration of the pregnancy and up to 6 weeks after the birth of the child. In addition, the program offers participants weekly education class and support, a referral program for men to the fatherhood program, monthly home visits to set goals and discuss intimate issues for mom, and priority for the child into child care with Early Head Start.

All of our early education programs engage parents in their child's learning and assist the parents in attaining their educational, literacy and employment goals.

Our home visitors provide parent education, child development evaluations, access to health care, and referrals to other community resources. The program is designed to optimize child growth and development and encourage resilient, healthy families and healthy children. Family Services administers the Healthy Families Indiana program for Tippecanoe and Carroll Counties.
- 3) **Reliance Homecare** assists frail, elderly, and homebound individuals to remain in their own homes when they have difficulties in caring for their basic needs. Trained homemakers assist with cleaning, laundry, meal preparation, shopping, and other activities of daily living. We offer a sliding fee scale based on household income. Description: Tippecanoe County is divided into 13 townships. A Township Trustee is an elected official who is, among other duties, responsible for township assistance for established residents of their township.

This *may* include help with food, shelter, utilities (not including back rent, deposits, reconnect fees, or penalties), clothing, prescription medicine, and funeral expenses. Each Township has different guidelines based on standards set by the State. Income guidelines are based on 100% or more of the current Federal Poverty guidelines; some exceptions may apply. Indiana Code states that applicants must use all federal resources first (Area IV, FSSA, HUD, etc.). Applicants may be referred to community agencies first.

To apply for assistance, call the appropriate Township Trustee. In some larger populated Townships, the Trustee may have staff to assist with the application process. Others handle the process themselves. Applicants may be required to show documentation of income, bills, etc. If denied services, the applicant should receive a form TA-1A stating the reason for denial.
